Working in Partnership for Success

The school will:

- Maintain a high standard of education that enables the development of the whole child through a diverse and stimulating curriculum.
- Care for each child's safety and well-being.
- Encourage the development of the children intellectually, physically, socially and spiritually, regardless of gender and cultural differences, enabling them to have the expectation of success.
- Encourage good manners and positive behaviour through teaching and by example.
- Provide opportunities for work at home, in accordance with our Homework policy.
- Teach children to develop a positive attitude towards everyone regardless of difference in gender, race, culture, belief, values, age, and need.
- Help children to understand their role in the village, wider and international community.
- Communicate effectively and sensitively with parents: via weekly newsletters, the website and regular pupil progress meetings.

The parents/carers will:

- Make sure that each child arrives at school on time.
- Make sure children wear suitable clothing in line with the school's code of dress and that the PE/games kit is brought to school each week.
- Support their children with work at home, as appropriate.

- Attend pupil progress meetings with the class teacher.
- Support the school's behaviour policy.
- Work in partnership with the school to develop positive attitudes towards those from different cultures and races and with different feelings, values and beliefs.
- Let the school know of any concerns that may affect their children's work or behaviour at school.
- Foster a positive attitude towards education and the school and use discretion when discussing issues or grievances in front of children or on social media sites.
- Not take their children out of school during term time except in exceptional circumstances.
- Not upload photographs or recordings made on school premises of pupils other than their own child to any social platforms or other public areas.

The child will:

- Respect other's culture, race, feelings, beliefs and values.
- Accept responsibility for the things they do.
- Take responsibility for school and home work and to ask for help and to do their best in all they undertake.
- Take good care of the building, equipment and school grounds.
- Behave in a safe way.
- Tell a member of staff if they are worried or unhappy.
- Follow the school values of respect, honesty, belief, forgiveness and empathy
- Will not bring into school any mobile phones or other personal device which allows access to the internet.
